

# EXHIBIT HALL RULES

## GENERAL INFORMATION

1. All Blue Ribbon Exhibit Hall classes are open to all who wish to participate; it is not necessary to be a resident of or employed by Teton County.
2. Exhibitors may enter up to two (2) items in each class unless otherwise noted.
3. If, after two (2) years, there have not been any entries in any one class, the Exhibit Hall Committee may eliminate or change that class.
4. Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and must not have been shown previously at the Teton County Fair.
5. Ribbons are awarded using the Danish System, meaning, exhibits will be judged against standards, not against other items in the class.
6. The Teton County Fair Board and Fair Office will take all reasonable precautions for the safekeeping of Exhibit Hall entries but will NOT be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
7. No entry shall receive a prize when deemed unworthy by the awarding judges, though it may be the only one of its kind entered.
8. Entries cannot be entered in the “any other” class if there is a class within the division for the item.
9. The Teton County Fair Board reserves the right to interpret these rules and regulations to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences.
10. All protests must be submitted in writing to the Fair Board Chair, PO Box 3075, Jackson, WY 83001 along with a check for \$25. If the protest is upheld, the check will be returned. If not, the check will be forfeited.
11. The Teton County Fair and Fair Office will not be responsible for picking up and storing Exhibit Hall entries.

# CLASS INFORMATION

## DEPARTMENT A: FARM TO FORK

Drop off items Tuesday July 27  
7:30 am – 2:00 pm

Display leafy vegetables in a wide-mouthed jar containing water; display all others on a paper plate, Brush dirt off items, but do not wash. All specimens should be:

- Fresh and of the same variety
- Uniform in color, size, and shape
- Mature, but not overripe
- Free from decay, damage, and disease

### Class 21: Extraordinary vegetable:

Largest, weirdest, or hardest to grow

**Division 4: Forage:** All entries must have been produced by the exhibitor and must be certified hay. Bundles or bales accepted.

## DEPARTMENT B: FLOWER GARDEN

Drop off items Tuesday July 27  
7:30 am – 2:00 pm

Flowers exhibited must have been grown and arranged by the exhibitor. Only foliage that is natural to the flower should be shown (but should be removed if under water). Exhibits should be displayed in a clear glass container provided by the exhibitor. All specimens should be free from defects, dirt, and disease and should be uniform in the following:

- Form
- Color
- Size
- Condition

**Class 13: What a clever ideal:** AN arrangement in a non-traditional container

**Class 14: Everlasting bouquet:** An arrangement consisting of dried, natural materials; feathers allowed.

**Class 15: Mix it up!** Use vegetables and flowers in one arrangement

**Class 17: Terrarium:** A planted, transparent container, partially or completely enclosed.

**No noxious weeds will be accepted for display. No white daisies in flower arrangement.**

## DEPARTMENT C: THE BAKERY

Drop off items Tuesday July 27  
7:30 am – 2:00 pm

Display baked items on paper plates in clear plastic bags; no foil wrap. Entries should be made from scratch (no box mixes).

Baked goods will be judged for:

- Flavor
- Aroma
- Texture
- Appearance

**Class 9: Ethnic bread or rolls:** Your favorite bread with cultural origins; enter 1 loaf or 6 rolls

**Class 15: Hybrid cookies:** Any combination of two or more types of cookies (i.e. peanut butter chocolate chip)

## DEPARTMENT D: FOOD PRESERVATION

Drop off items Tuesday July 27  
7:30 am – 2:00 pm

All canned exhibits must be in standard (Kerr, Ball) clear glass containers. Judges may open jars if considered necessary. Enter jars with screw bands only; no paraffin. All canned items must follow current USDA canning guidelines, which can be found here:

Each jar must have a label on the back with the following:

- Product name
- Processing date
- Processing method
- Processing time
- Altitude

Items will be judged on the following as applicable:

- Appearance and color
- Container/pack
- Consistency/texture
- Flavor

**Class 3: Jelly:** Made from fruit juice and sugar; clear and holds its shape

**Class 4: Jam:** Contains crushed fruit

**Class 5: Marmalade:** Citrus fruit and peel in jelly

**Class 6: Preserves:** Whole fruit in syrup

**Class 7: Butters:** Crushed fruit with a smooth texture; without seeds or skin

## DEPARTMENT E: BACKYARD FARM

Drop off items Tuesday July 27  
7:30 am – 2:00 pm

Items will be judged for the following:

- **Eggs:** Uniformity in appearance, color, shape, and size
- **Honey:** Color, consistency, cleanness, taste
- **Cheese:** Appearance, texture, flavor
- **Fiber:** Quality typical of breed, length, strength, condition

**Division 1: Market eggs:** Eggs from your coop. Display in container of choice

**Division 2: Honey:** Display in a clear glass jar

**Division 3: Cheese:** Display on a paper plate in a clear plastic bag

**Division 4: Fiber:** Wool from your flock. Display in a clear plastic bag

## DEPARTMENTS F, G, H: NEEDLEWORK, QUILTING & SEWING

Drop off items Tuesday July 27  
7:30 am – 2:00 pm

Items must have been completed within the last three (3) years.

Articles must be clean and neat in appearance.

Items will be judged for:

- Workmanship
- Design and color
- Suitability of the material
- General appearance

**Department G: Quilts:** A quilt is constructed of three (3) layers (top fabric, batting, and backing fabric) that are stitched together. If a quilt has been pieced and quilted by two different people, both names must be included on the entry form.

**Division 1: Hand quilted bed/throw:** A large quilt is one that is greater than 108 inches total length plus width. A small quilt is not to exceed 108 inches total length plus width

**Division 2: Machine quilted**

**bed/throw:** A large quilt is one that is greater than 108 inches total length plus width. A small quilt is not to exceed 108 inches total length plus width

**Division 3: New quilter:** Less than two years' experience quilting

**Division 4: Wall and Art Quilts:** A large wall/art quilt is greater than 72 inches total, not to exceed 120 inches total length plus width. A small wall/art quilt is not to exceed 72 inches total length plus width

**Division 4: Misc. Needlework, Teton County Centennial:** Any needlework creation celebrating Teton County's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary through materials, theme, colors etc. or the exhibitor's interpretation of the centennial.



**DEPARTMENTS I, J, K: ADULT PAINTING & DRAWING, PHOTOGRAPHY, DIGITAL ARTS**

**Drop off items Tuesday July 27 7:30 am – 2:00 pm**

All entries must be mounted in foam core, mat board, or framed. Wire must be attached for hanging. For the safety of all exhibits, if your item has any other type of hanging system, it will be accepted at the discretion of the Exhibit Hall Committee.

Artwork will be judged for:

- Composition
- Technique
- Emotional impact

**Department J: Adult Photography:**

Photos must not be digitally changed or altered outside of normal cropping, color and/or brightness correction, and red eye removal; photos with heavy changes (i.e. Photoshopped) should be entered in Department K: Digital Arts, Division 2: Photomanipulation.

**Department K: Digital Arts:** Entries in the department are for works created in computer programs such as Illustrator, Photoshop or similar

**Class 3: Photomanipulation:** Photos that have been altered or changed beyond basic corrections (cropping, color/brightness adjustments)

**TETON COUNTY CENTENNIAL:** Any artwork medium celebrating Teton County's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary through materials, theme, colors etc. or the exhibitor's interpretation of the centennial.



**DEPARTMENT L: ADULT CREATIONS**

**Drop off items Tuesday July 27 7:30 am – 2:00 pm**

Items must have been completed within the last two (2) years. Items will be judged on the following:

- Appearance
- Technique
- Craftmanship

**Division 7: Upcycle:** Take something old and make it new again.

**TETON COUNTY CENTENNIAL:** Any artwork medium celebrating Teton County's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary through materials, theme, colors etc. or the exhibitor's interpretation of the centennial.



**DEPARTMENT M: TETON SPA**

**Drop off items Tuesday July 27 7:30 am – 2:00 pm**

Items will be judged on the following:

- Appearance
- Consistency
- Scent appeal

**Class 2: Lotion:** Display in a clear container with a lid



**DEPARTMENTS N, O: TEEN ARTS, JUNIOR ARTS**

**Drop off Items Tuesday July 27 7:30 am – 2:00 pm**

All entries must be mounted on foam core, mat board, or framed. Wire must be attached for hanging. For the safety of all exhibits, if your item has any other type of hanging system, it will be accepted at the discretion of the Exhibit Hall Committee.

Artwork will be judged for:

- Composition
- Technique

- Emotional impact

**Division 2: Teen/Junior Photography:**

Photos must not be digitally changed or altered outside of normal cropping, color and/or brightness correction, and red eye removal; photos with heavy changes or alterations should be entered in division 3: Teen Digital Arts, Class 12: Photomanipulation.

**Class 9: Selfie:** May contain one (1) or more individuals, but the exhibitor must be in the selfie and the one that took the selfie

**Class 10: Instagram Snap:** Choose the best photo posted to your Instagram that was taken with your phone

**Class 11: Graphic Design:** Your best Illustrator (or similar program) work of art

**Class 12: Photomanipulation:** Show off your Photoshop skills with a photo that is edited beyond basic corrections (cropping, color and brightness adjustments)



**DEPARTMENT P: BEGINNER ART**

**Drop off items Tuesday July 27 7:30 am – 2:00 pm**



**DEPARTMENTS Q, R, S: TEEN CREATIONS, JUNIOR CREATIONS, BEGINNER CREATIONS**

**Drop items off Tuesday July 27 7:30 am – 2:00 pm**

Items will be judged on the following:

- Creativity
- Appearance
- Technique

**Upcycle:** Take something old and make it new again

**Fairy Garden:** Use plants, flowers, and items planted in a creative container to create the perfect home for your garden-dwelling friends

**Mini Fresh Flower Arrangement:** Measuring no larger than 5 inches in all directions in a container of your choice

**Pet Rock:** Show off your friend! Rock weight must be between 2 ounces and 2 pounds. Rock may be dressed

in man-made attire or decoratively painted

**Collection of 100:** Any collection of 100 items that can fit in a shoe box.

Examples: military figurines, cars, beads, rocks, stamps etc.

**TETON COUNTY CENTENNIAL:** Any creation made out of 100 household items i.e. pasta, Q-tips, cotton balls, toothpicks etc. celebrating Teton County's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.
